## Pastor's Report – Bob DiSalvio

Year of transitioning – Still trying to get people into church. Some are afraid of Covid and don't want to come. Live streaming doing well. The phone is good for shut-ins that don't have computers. Pastor still able to visit people and go into hospitals. Have several close to finishing the discipleship. Suggestion to say Prayer of Salvation at end of each sermon. Bible Study for Revelation was well attended via phone.

Treasurer's Report – Lauren Frankevich reporting for Erik Frankevich

Amwell Church of the Brethren was blessed again financially last year despite the continued difficult circumstances we all endured.

Regular weekly offering was under our budget of \$147,288.42 by \$11,674.34 with a total of \$135,614.08 in total collected. This was still an impressive total considering the reduction of inperson attendance many times through the year.

Our 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday monthly mission offering totaled \$2,397.00, under the \$3,000.00 budget by \$603.

The missionaries we support receive year-end offerings consisting of 10% of the regular weekly offering plus the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday monthly mission collections. We are able to send \$15,958 in support of them. We were also able to send financial support to The Flemington Food Pantry

and Children's Hunger Fund with donations gathered during our VBS program. In addition, we sent support to Teen Challenge in the amount of \$750 and through our Jesus Birthday offering we sent \$2,500 to Samaritans Purse in support of the Kentucky Tornado victims. We also received additional income from various donations in the amount of \$1,286. The budget for 2021 was set at \$151,568.42 for total income. Actual income was \$143,004.09. Most expense categories were under budget last year. The total expense for 2021 was \$147,598.43. This includes the remaining balance of the A/V system installation and associated office furniture, and PC purchase expenses as well as the necessary flood damage repairs incurred in September. The budgeted expense for 2021 was \$151,068.42. Our general bank account balances as of 12/31/21 were: Checking: \$15,511.89

Savings: \$152,770.45

God was faithful to our church in 2021 and through generous giving of our church family we have been able to meet the needs of our church and continue to reach out to help others.

## Trustees Report – 2022 Budget Meeting – Mark Smith

Arranged for and oversaw project management of:

- Removed sound equipment to make way for construction
- Remove one pew to make room for platform
- Construct platform approximately 8" high apply commercial grade peel and stick carpet tiles
- Added power outlets
- Installed partitioning for sound booth
- Installed sound system
- Reconnect Propane tank
- Cleaning of the Sanctuary Initially cleaned by Trustees. Trying to find a cleaning service, all currently backed up due to hurricane.
- Repair floor damage in hallway
- Replace three broken windows in crawlspace
- Repair AC units that were flooded Have one verbal estimate from Mark Pfeninger for <\$1,000</li>
- Fill washed out areas in the lawn Parker Waldron in process
- Install a sump pump under kitchen

Proposed projects:

- Need quote to redo front steps, patio, and wall.
- Need quote to refurbish room at garage end and storage area next to it.
- Need quote to install a sump pump under Sanctuary and another under kitchen.

## Deacon's Report – Jeff Kiskurno & Mark Smith

The deacon's provided some assistance this year and through the Benevolent Fund in 2021. It was suggested by the Pastor that we consider sending some aid to the people in Kentucky who suffered great loss from the tornadoes last fall. The COS approved on sending the Jesus Birthday offering and making up the difference to \$2,500.00. A check was sent to Samaritan's

Purse for that amount to help them. The deacon's sent the following missionaries checks for their determined amount as in prior years:

The Dillinger's have retired form Crossworld and we are trying to determine if they are still involved in their mission outreach in any way.
